August 1—31: Adult Summer Library Program Continues!

Everyone 18 and older is encouraged to participate in the 2022 program that runs thru August 31. Adults are still welcome to join! This year's theme is *Read Beyond the Beaten Path*.

Notes from the Friends of the JKPL meeting on August 1, 2022

The Friends Board welcomed two new members – Mari Vorwald and Nancy Breitbach.

December Bus Trip is full. They are hoping fuel prices continue to drop as current high rates will result in an increase in cost for the bus, with resulting lower profits.

Used Book sale was very successful. They brought in \$762.75. They plan to hold another sale in January and go back to their previous schedule of July and January. There are a lot of books still available for the next sale so Shirley V. and volunteers will scan everything that is remaining on the shelves for Sustainable Shelves (SS). What SS doesn't want will be selectively boxed up for the Amish or saved for the next sale. This should be completed by October 1 so that the Friends can restock the shelves to prepare for the January sale.
