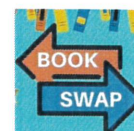

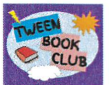

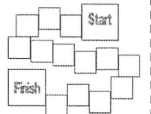

Brainfuse HelpNow offers personalized homework help in core subjects (math, reading, writing, science and social studies), including SAT preparation. Brainfuse is available to all library patrons from any computer with internet connection.

HELPNOW

HelpNow provides learning solutions for students of diverse needs and backgrounds. Students communicate with live, online tutors using an interactive, virtual whiteboard. HelpNow also offers skills building and test preparation with the ability to connect to a live tutor to review the topics and questions covered in the quiz. All live tutoring sessions are saved and can be replayed as well as shared with friends and teachers.

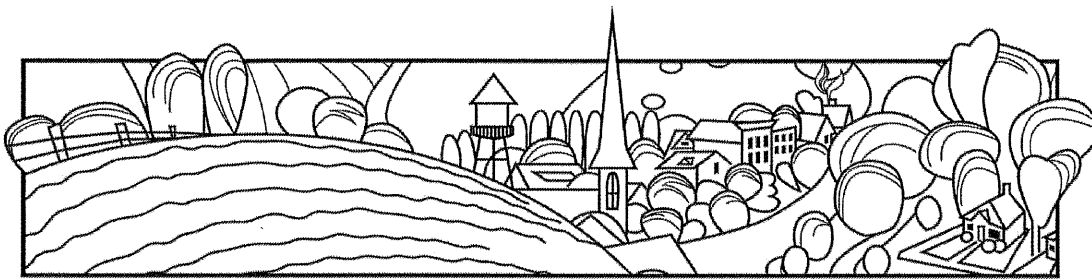

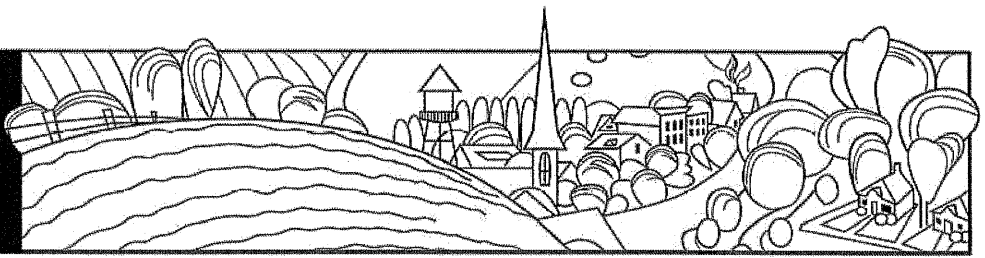
