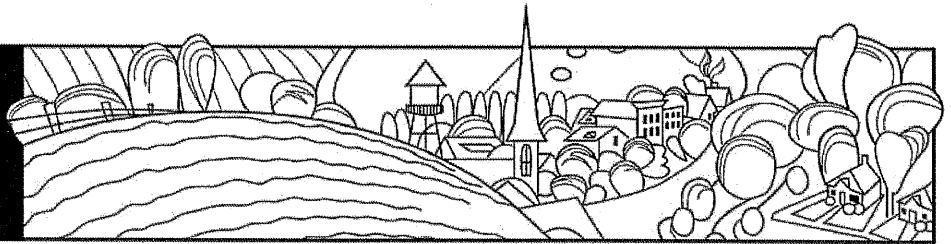





Remote Work

Full Time and Regular Part Time Employees may temporarily be assigned to provide essential services from home or another location. Tasks may include:

- Responding to phone and email messages from the public, staff, colleagues, and vendors
- Maintaining the library website and Facebook
- Building and ordering lists of items for purchase
- Reviewing policies, procedures, and staff manuals
- Offering virtual story times, book clubs, and other programs
- Planning future programs and publicity
- Completing grant applications
- Participating in online continuing education
- Preparing future schedules
- Communicating updates to staff
- Updating item records in the catalog

Required Equipment

The following equipment and services are required for remote work:

- Internet
- Phones
- Computer
- Software: Excel, Access, Word, Publisher, Library ILS, Library Google Drive
- Necessary documents: manuals, policies, desk schedule
- Access to library documents and files (staff will need to store on flash drive as remote access to Library Server is not currently an option.)

Minimum Staffing Level

Two healthy library employees must be available to work at the library during all hours of operation. An inability to maintain this temporary minimum level will result in reduced hours or closing the library to all services.

One healthy library employee must be available to work during a library closure for at least two hours a day in order to empty the book drop, and organize materials.

If no healthy library employees are available, the book drop bins shall be removed and items allowed to collect on the floor until such time as a healthy employee can return. This will increase the amount of time needed to prepare the library to reopen.

Procurement

If the library building is accessible to staff and delivery services, the Librarians will place materials orders as usual.

If the library building is inaccessible to staff or delivery services, the Librarians will suspend orders of physical materials focus on collecting and promoting digital resources such as databases, e-books, e-audiobook.

Legal Considerations

The State of Iowa has deemed patron records to be confidential as cited in Chapter 22.7 of the Code of Iowa. CONFIDENTIALITY OF LIBRARY RECORDS must be followed by library staff at all times.

As trusted providers of information, library staff must only give information from or refer patrons to federal, state, and local authorities when patrons ask questions about current emergency situations.

Review of COOP by Library Staff

Newly hired library staff will read over the COOP as part of their introductory training. The COOP will be available as part of the JKPL policies. The Library Director and Assistant Library Director will ensure library staff review the COOP at least once each calendar year.

Returning to Normal Operations

Staff should be prepared to return to work immediately when it's deemed safe to resume operations. In case of a library closure, the following tasks may need to be performed before the library reopens to the public:

- Contact staff and determine schedules
- Update computers
- Check in and shelve any remaining items
- Move furniture or other items back in place as needed
- Communicate with patrons through the library web site and social media accounts

Notes from Fundraising Committee Meeting – March 2020 - Electronic

The fundraising committee of the James Kennedy Public Library met electronically during the week of March 24, 2020. Participants were chairperson Mary Jane Meade and members Catherine O'Hea, Karen Kramer, Brenda Ingles, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

Love My Library Giving Tree: This event officially ended on February 29, 2020 and brought in \$2,849.00.

Mystery Dinner: This event is scheduled to be held at the Dyersville Social Center on Saturday, February 13, 2021 with a snow date of Saturday, February 27th. J & D Catering will cater and Die Laughing is confirmed as the performers. The confirmation email from Die Laughing was hesitant about the new show being ready. This email came from Terry, not Molly who said she has previously said she would have it ready. Molly is the writer. The committee decided to plan for this event, assuming the new performance would be ready. If it is not, we will evaluate options and alternatives in the fall.

Build-a-Basket Fundraiser: This event started February 1 with silent auction scheduled to run March 2 - 29. As the library is closed to public access, the auction has been extended. The consensus of the committee is that the best option is to plan for two weeks of bidding once the public is allowed in the library, and holding our closing reception and end of bidding on the Sunday closest to that. Based on current information, the Closing Reception and ending of the auction is scheduled for May 17. This could change if the closure is extended.

STEM Night Fundraiser at Country Junction: This was very successful with more than 60 people participating. Dave Buchheit donated \$500 and that check has been received. Mary Jane will send Thank You notes to Mr. Buchheit and Danielle Will for their involvement. We would like to plan this as an annual event so will reach out to Mr. Buchheit in the fall or winter to explore this option.

Wine and Beer Tasting: This event was originally scheduled for Friday, April 17 from 5 to 8 pm. At the time of the electronic meeting, things were scheduled to reopen so we left this on the schedule. When the closures were announced to be continuing through the month of April, Shirley contacted Becca at Brew and Brew. It was decided to cancel this event for the spring and reevaluate once businesses were able to be open to the public. Hopefully we will be able to reschedule for some time in the fall.

Plant Sale Fundraiser: This event is currently scheduled for Saturday, May 16, 2020 from 8 to 10 am in the JKPL parking lot.

Making and selling upcycled greeting cards: Nothing new on this idea.

Pop-Up Fundraisers: As noted at last month's meeting, the committee will consider the possibility of doing pop-up fundraisers at Pizza Hut and / or Subway when the weather is nicer. We are also planning to partner with Dairy Queen for an event there sometime in the summer. We will follow up on this ideas once businesses start reopening.

Rounding up Fundraisers: Due to the current challenges to small businesses, the committee decided to put these ideas on hold until the fall or after things started to open up again.

Set date for next meeting : Tentatively scheduled for Monday, April 13. If not able to meet in person, the committee will discuss meeting via email or virtually via Zoom.

Notes from the April 30, 2020 Zoom meeting of the Fundraising Committee:

The fundraising committee of the James Kennedy Public Library met via Zoom at 6:00 pm on Thursday, April 30, 2020. Participants were chairperson Mary Jane Meade and members Catherine O'Hea, Karen Kramer, and Shirley Vonderhaar. Karen was not at the meeting but providing input to Shirley prior to the meeting, which was shared with those present. Brenda Ingles was excused.

Love My Library Giving Tree: Another donation was received since the last committee meeting, bringing the total for this fundraiser to \$1,999 plus \$1011 (for water cooler / fountain) for a total of \$3010. Last year's event brought in \$2709.00.

Mystery Dinner: No action needed at this time.

Build-a-Basket Fundraiser: This event was scheduled to end with a reception in March but was postponed due to Covid-19. Since it will likely be June when we reopen in any fashion and then it will be under very limited circumstances; and since some of the baskets are time sensitive (Easter) or contain perishable items, the committee agreed that we needed to conclude this auction virtually rather than continuing to postpone until the library reopens to the public. Since we have previously posted that the fundraiser would continue the first 2 weeks of May and end on 17, we are going to follow that same timeline but end on Monday, May 18 at 7 pm. Dawn will create a webpage with all the baskets, descriptions, photos and current bids. Paul will link and promote via social media. Staff will call bidders to let them know the process, ending date, confirm if they want to keep current bid and offer a reserve bidding process. The plan is for this all to go live on or before Tuesday, May 2.

STEM Night Fundraiser at Country Junction: No action needed at this time. As the first one (held in early March) was so successful, committee hopes to hold again as a regular spring event but will wait until the fall or restrictions start changing before contacting Dave Buchheit / Country Junction.

Wine and Beer Tasting: This spring event has been cancelled and the plan is to reschedule when restrictions start changing.

Plant Sale Fundraiser: This event is scheduled for May 16. Although the library is still scheduled to be closed at this time, the committee would like to offer this event as Committee members have plants ready to donate and there might be members of the community in that position as well. Since the library is able to offer curbside service, the committee is planning for this event to be managed in a similar touchless fashion. As in the past, Shirley will contact the city and ask for permission to close the half of the city / library parking lot that is closest to the street on Saturday, May 16. Plants will be set out on tables or a flatbed with signs regarding maintaining social distance, respecting others, etc. Envelopes will be left out with signs for those interested to take what they need, put their money in an envelope, and drop into the library drop box. The recommended amount will be \$2.00 or \$5.00 per plant, based on the size but it will all be on the honors system.

Candy Sales: With the current library closure and reduced access to the library for upcoming months, Shirley reported that she was concerned that some items might be nearing their best by dates. The Committee agreed that items should be reviewed and anything that was near its best by date be made

available for staff or board to purchase for a donation. Shirley will have a staff member review everything and offer items to the staff first. If there is still a lot left, she will email the Board to see if they have any interest. Items will continue to be disposed of in this fashion until the library is able to reopen to the public with limited restrictions or until all of the items are gone. New snacks will be purchased when appropriate.

Making and selling upcycled greeting cards: Nothing new on this idea.

Pop-Up Fundraisers: The plan was to talk with Pizza Hut & Subway about hosting pop-up fundraisers this spring / summer. We were also planning to partner with Dairy Queen for an event in the summer, similar to that held last August.
